

The year presented its fair share of challenges and inconvenience with the construction work being carried out, both inside and outside the Club, but it also presented some proud moments for the Club and I believe the results speak for themselves.

Financial Performance

The Club outsourced the operations during 2012. Despite total revenue decreasing over the period, the net revenue excluding Catering increased by 7.8% to \$17.5m (2011: \$16.2m). The significant increase in revenue has resulted in a net profit after tax of \$1,225 (2011: \$699k) an increase of 75%. The EBITDA improved to 19.3% (2011: 15.8%). of the Clubs Master Plan complete. The financial impact of external catering to the Club has been enormous. The Sustainability catering revenue has increased from The Penrith RSL team has made a \$2.5m (Internal Catering) to over \$4m (with External Catering). The buffet represents a great value for money dining experience and since opening in August has served up to 20,000 patrons each month.

What's Next?


Not to lose the momentum of change and growth, Penrith RSL members and guests will soon see the refurbishment of the first floor.

enrith RSL Club's current Sustainability Projects:

Love Food Hate Waste Program

The Club became members of the Love Food Hate Waste Program in 2012, and although we do not produce food we are committed to reducing the amount of waste that occurs from our Catering Contractors.

The Love Food Hate Waste Program aims to raise awareness about the impact of food waste in NSW and reduce how much 'good' food businesses waste. Love Food Hate Waste is managed by the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) partnering with corporate, government and not-for-profit organisations committed to reducing food waste in NSW. With this in mind the Club decided to look into organic composting. After researching quite a few models we decided to go with the Closed Loop Organics Unit CLO100.

Organics Recycling

This unit effectively composts almost all food scraps onsite and converts them to 10% of their size within a 24 hour period through composting. The unit is self contained so it does not attract pests and is virtually odour free.

Through education and awareness our Contract Caterers are steadily building up the amount of food waste going into the unit which will in turn avoid CO2 emissions associated with landfill and transportation of waste.

The unit is capable of composting 200-250kgs of food waste per day and once full we will have produced soil fertiliser for our gardens. We plan to give excess fertiliser to our staff and patrons. Patrons will be advised of pick up days and we will determine a practical way of distributing the fertiliser.

Paper Towels

After investigation the Club identified the excess of paper towel usage within our bathrooms. The amount of waste that was produced by the paper towels was extreme and we started to think about alternatives that were more sustainable.

Eventually the Club decided on the BioDryer from JetDryer. This unit was determined to be very efficient in use with low power consumption but quick hand drying and automatic shut off. We also have these installed in our staff wash areas to try and completely erase paper towels in 95% of the Club.





PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am pleased to report another good year for our sub-Branch. We have finally seen the completion of Memory Park and I congratulate all of those who have been involved in this project over many years. In particular past President and Life Member Clive Connor and Life Member Norm Andrews who were the driving force behind the project in the early days. More recently, your Management Committee has worked closely with Penrith City Council to finalise the Master Plan during 2011/2012. We had to work around the construction for the ANZAC services in 2012 and fortunately we managed to do that with just a few changes to our normal format. We are all looking forward to ANZAC Sunday and the Dawn Service this year to showcase the park for our members and the people of Penrith. There will be an official re-opening of the park by the NSW Governor on Thursday 11th July. At the same time the Governor will unveil the Korean War plaque at the memorial. Incidentally, July 11 is the official birthday of the Royal Australian Navy.

Another memorable event for the sub-Branch was the exposure of Penrith RSL War Memorial Display on Radio Station 2GB and Channel 9 News. This was a story on the handing in of long lost medals of a World War 2 Prisoner of War for which the sub-Branch searched and located the descendants of the original owner. The late Peter Harvey, visited the club to do a story on the recovery of the medals and the part played by Penrith RSL sub Branch and the War Memorial Display. The War Memorial Display is a joint initiative of our sub-Branch and Penrith RSL Club Ltd. So that we may maintain the momentum and relevance of this display we need to further engage the Penrith Community and in particular our youth. To this end we have formed a joint Committee with the Club Ltd to guide and manage the display.

During 2012 the sub-Branch made some progress toward the establishment of a Day Club in Penrith. John Love has done a fair bit of work on the project despite having to take extended leave for health reasons. We are now well advanced and the inaugural public meeting to form the Day Club will be held at the Glenmore Park Salvation Army Hall on Wednesday 26th June. We have also made moves to establish a Youth Council but still have a bit of work to do to get this off the ground. Hopefully a bit more involvement with local schools and junior sports will pay off in the long run. We are looking at partnering with the Club

Ltd on some youth projects which will allow us to run the Youth Council on a sound financial footing.

Welfare has been a bit of a challenge this year with ill health taking a toll on our Welfare and Pension Officers. Fortunately we have been able to call on the services of Ray Westwell, who will be at the sub-Branch offices every Monday to assist John Love and to attend to pensions and welfare as required. John Ronan continues to do an excellent job as Hospital Visitation Officer and his visits to our members and other ex-service people who find themselves confined to bed are greatly appreciated. If we have any budding Welfare or Pensions Officers, or if you just want to know how the system works, I encourage you to enrol in the available TIP Courses as they come to town. We are now a preferred venue for DVA to run these courses.

The establishment of our Policies and Procedures Manual is a work in progress but hopefully will be finalised in 2013. This project is very time consuming but eventually will be of benefit to the sub-Branch in the smooth running of the office and events and most importantly will mean we meet the more stringent requirements of the newly formed Office of Charities and the recently introduced Workplace Health & Safety Regulations. Not everybody agrees that we should have to comply with these new rules because we use 'volunteers' and not employees. However it is black and white in the legislation and basically means that volunteers like paid workers must be trained, know their job and be made aware of any risks they could encounter. Eventually audits will be carried out on charitable organisations to ensure they are complying with the new rules. Because of the size of our asset base at over \$4 million we stand out as a potential target for audit by the regulators.

The Club Ltd are planning a major refurbishment of the "old club" area, i.e., the Castlereagh Street entrance, the Legends Bar, Snooker Room and the sub-Branch offices. The Club will be building a brand new Sports Bar area including new sub-Branch rooms adjacent to the Tindale Street entrance. This new area will provide the sub-Branch with modern office facilities with public access for welfare, education and training purposes. More on this as things develop, but at this stage we look like moving around November this year.

I wish to record my appreciation of the hard work put in by the Management Committee

during 2012 and in particular John King and his team in the office. John has decided to take on the more leisurely role of Vice President this year and will also take over the role of Social Coordinator. Mick McConnell has bravely stepped up to the Honorary Secretary position. We also welcome on board Ron Broom, who will be responsible for Membership and Public Relations. The Management Committee are in the process of setting up a number of subcommittees to help spread the workload. If any member wishes to get a bit more involved please see any of the Committee members - they will greatly appreciate any assistance you can provide, no matter how small. Thank you also to the other organisations who help us celebrate ANZAC and Remembrance Day, the Rural Fire Service who act as marshals, the bands who keep us in step and the school choirs. Not to forget the hard working ladies of our Women's Auxiliary who do a fabulous fund raising job during the year as well as helping out when requested. And also the staff of Penrith RSL Club who provide excellent service as usual along with Lisa and her staff at Maze Group.

On a more sombre note you are probably aware Tom Kelly is battling a serious illness. Tom has been a stalwart at the sub-Branch, helping out in the office, being our main contact with the Nashos and organising a social event or two. Our thoughts are with Tom at this time.

Finally, my thanks to you, the members who still take an active interest in the sub-Branch and support us in our work in helping our mates and keeping the memory of service to our country alive.

TREASURER'S REPORT

I would like to report that the sub-Branch has had a good year financially returning a net surplus of \$165,238 an improvement of \$134,000 compared to last year.

Revenue for the year improved substantially from \$189,692 in 2011 to \$326,086 in 2012 even though it was 16% below our budget forecast. This in the main is attributed to the returns from the WealthView Investment Account increasing by \$37,000. Our rental income also increased by \$22,000 mainly due to the acquisition of the DHA investment property at Blaxland. While we received \$24,000 in grants

for the Memorabilia display.

Total expenses were below budget by 17.2% but were similar to 2011 only \$2,397 higher. Our surplus for the year of \$165,238 is about \$30,000 below forecast.

However, the end result is that we have fully paid for the running of the sub-Branch and members' equity has increased by 2.3%.

Further donations were made to a number of worthy causes during the year totalling \$28,480 -. RSL Welfare Benevolent Fund - \$11,000, Flight for Cancer \$2,000, RSL NSW Admin Fund, \$10,000, Naval Association Blue Mountains \$1,000 and Nepean Legacy - \$2,000. We also continued our support of Bowraville sub-Branch with \$1,336 to assist with their administration costs.

Membership fees for our members were subsidised by \$13,410 for the year.

Whilst returns from our investment portfolio were below our original forecasts they remained positive, improving from the previous year. Importantly we were able to achieve this result while also building and paying for the Memorabilia Display. Our total investment portfolio at 31 December 2012 stood at just under \$4 Million.

I would like to thank the sub-Branch office staff for their assistance over the last 12 months.


